Health Requirements: All llamas must be registered with the ILR. All llamas must have a health certificate issued within 30 days of the fair. **Out-of-state** Virginia requires out-of-state llamas be tested and found negative for TB, brucellosis and blue tongue within 30 days of the fair.

Juvenile: 08/06/05 to 03/05/06

Yearling: 08/06/04 to 08/05/05

Two-year: 08/06/03 to 08/05/04

Adult: on or before 08/05/03

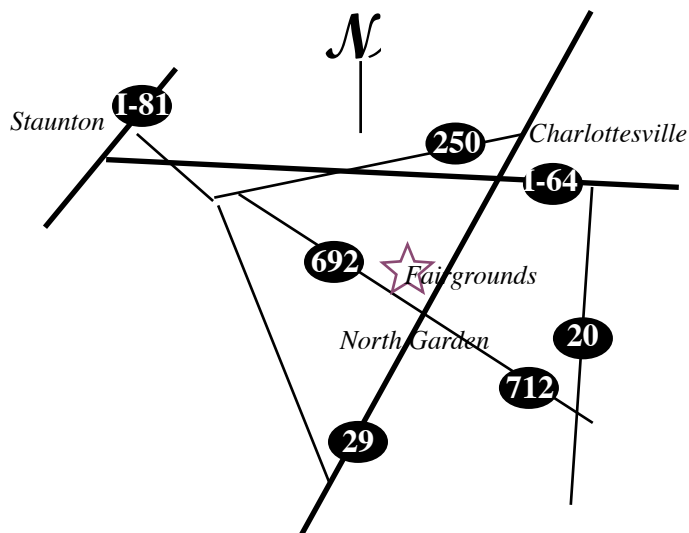
Show Ring and Parking: The show ring will be uncovered near the livestock ring. Trailers must enter through the livestock gate and park near the ring. Exhibitors are welcome to set panels up by their trailers and use generators if you have them. All llamas must be on the grounds by 9:00 a.m. The fair opens at 10:00 a.m.

Arrivals: Early arrivals are welcome. You may enter the livestock gate at any time, however **NO TRAILERS** are permitted to unload by the livestock tent after 3:30 p.m. on Friday or 9:00 a.m. Saturday. If you arrive after these times you'll have to walk you llamas and equipment to the tent. Please let me know if you plan to arrive on Friday.

Displays and Exhibits: Please contact me if you wish to display llamas during the week of the fair other than showing on Saturday.

Volunteers: Would it be a llama show without a plea for help to run the show? We'll need clerks, gate people, ring stewards, awards presenters, etc... Please let me know if you are available to help.

Please do not bring dogs to the show. If you must, please keep them crated.
